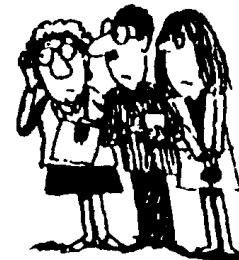

A Note from Sr. Karen . . .

Oftentimes the hardest words to say are the most important in a relationship. What leaps to my mind in light of recent revelations of clergy abuse in Europe are the words "I am sorry." And though I was not a perpetrator of this abuse and violence, I am all too aware that in my position as the leader of this community of faith, I represent the institutional Church. I understand that there are those in this community that cannot walk through the doors of our Church because of wrong done to them or to someone they love, or because the Church appears to be covering up wrongdoing rather than calling it to the light. This reality causes me sadness for the trust that has been breached and the relationships that are broken.

If, over the course of the almost 4 years I have served this community, I have caused hurt or separation of an individual or family from this community of faith, I am sorry. In my role as a representative of our Church, I would like to apologize to anyone who has been a victim of institutional abuse or violence. I can make no excuse for the sins of our Church; all I can do is say how very sorry I am.

Relationships are at the heart of who we are as human beings and the primary relationship is between us and God. Often this relationship is mediated by the Church. When the Church misuses the trust of the faithful and turns a blind eye to abuse, the Church is wrong. And as in our other relationships, a break in trust takes much honesty, patience and hard work to forgive and move beyond. That relationship, if it survives, is never the same.

If you or someone you know has suffered abuse at the hands of a representative of our Church; clergy, religious or lay, please call the number below or use the email contact. All communication is kept confidential. And if you would rather speak to one of us on staff, do not hesitate to contact Fr. Michael or myself. Let us not keep our heads in the sand, but rather bring what needs to be healed to the light so that together we can offer prayers for healing and share conversations toward understanding.

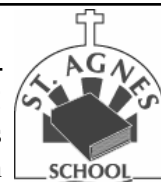

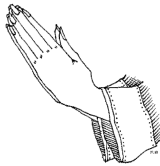

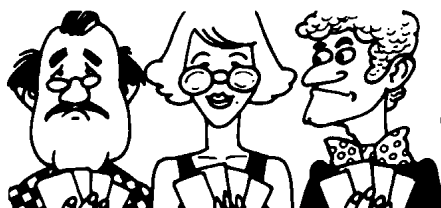
