A Note from Sr. Karen . . .

The transition is here – and coming fast!

I thought I would take this space to help orient all of us as to what is happening when – for your prayerful consideration, in addition to good information. These past few weeks the Transition Team has met twice, the second time with Parish Council Leadership and have reached consensus concerning our revised Mass schedule. This was announced last week and can also be found elsewhere in this bulletin.

Also, earlier this month each of our three parishes were asked to submit a “parish profile” to the Diocesan Office of Priest Personnel. These profiles serve as advertisements for consideration by priests and pastoral administrators. The profiles will be posted sometime in early February, with letters of interest to be sent to the Personnel Director by early March. It is my understanding that the personnel committee will meet in mid-March and recommendations made to Bishop Clark shortly thereafter. It is my hope that we will know who the new Pastoral Leader of our cluster will be by the end of March. This is important information for you to have and I ask that you keep this whole process and all involved in your prayers.

The staff members of the three parishes will meet in mid-February to continue our conversations. We will further discuss Faith Formation and Youth Ministry schedules and work toward having all those who volunteer in music ministry get together for prayer and conversation. Also, I hope you will see a new bulletin – a shared effort of all 3 parishes – in the very near future. Gradually, the pieces are coming together.

Because we have been assigned Fr. Michael Upson, we can expect to have all the typical Holy Week and Easter liturgies here at St. Agnes for this year. Sometime after Easter and before the end of June, we will begin putting the revised Mass schedule into place. This is to allow us some time to get used to the changes before the new leader arrives on the scene.

This compilation of information can be overwhelming, but it is so important that we keep saying it over and over again. We all need to be aware that change is coming, whether we like it or not. And I need to say that thus far, I have been so comforted by the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit, guiding the work of the Transition Team and parish leadership. These have truly been graced days, though not without their challenges. Please continue to keep us all in your prayers, and be assured of mine for all of you – each and every day.

St. Agnes, St. Paul of the Cross, St. Rose Transition Team meets

The Transition Team of our pending cluster met Thursday evening, January 14, along with the chair of the St. Agnes Parish Council and the chair and vice chair of the St. Paul, St. Rose combined Parish Council. Here are some of the highlights:

We reviewed the Family Feedback forms in light of the original criteria we established. It was a good conversation, grounded in a passion for each individual community and an awareness that change is inevitable and that we are all about the same purpose of building the kingdom of God.

As a reminder, the criteria are:

- Sufficient travel time between churches.
- Sufficient time between Masses for the priest to prepare and interact with parishioners.
- Allow the largest number of parishioners to attend Mass at most popular times.
- Determine earliest and latest possible Masses based on experience.
- Pay attention to maximizing collection totals.
- Consider liturgical ministries, including music
- Sufficient time for Sunday morning Faith Formation.

After discussion, the revised Mass schedule was decided and announced in our churches last weekend.

Building Faithful Citizenship

In today's second reading St. Paul reminds the Corinthians that we are all baptized in one Spirit and each member of the body of Christ has a particular function that affects the whole. "If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it..."

Today's reading from Paul's first letter to the people of Corinth tells us that we (i.e. all the members of the Church) make up Christ's body. Therefore, like Christ, our lives should always point to God. When we live our lives with our focus on God, we stay the course on our path to holiness – our vocation. 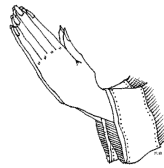
